Project Labor Agreements Are About:

Public Project Labor Agreements (PLAs) are a part of public construction contracts that require contractors and subcontractors to abide by the terms and work conditions found in union contracts and to pay union level wages and benefits.

Why Are PLAs Important to Me?

Skilled Workers

- Ensuring that the best trained and safest workers are building Minnesota.
- Ensuring that the workers building Minnesota have Health, Dental, and Vision insurance for their families.

Building On-Time and Under Budget

- PLA projects have been shown to help public construction work get done faster at lower costs, saving Minnesota tax dollars.
- This means more tax dollars are available for more Highway and Building Construction, and more work for Laborers.

Governor Pawlenty Doesn't Care What is Important to Me:

On November 21, 2005 Governor Pawlenty signed an executive order effectively eliminating PLAs on state projects.
